"After successful premiere in 2022, Seagriculture USA returns to Portland, Maine, for second edition in September 2023"

Maine is an ideal place to cultivate kelps, with its clean, cold water, abundant coastline, and knowledgeable fishermen. Kelps are cultivated on sea farms, which are leased from the State of Maine through the Department of Marine Resources. Because kelp is a winter crop, it can be grown in the "off-season" in Maine, when most lobster fishing and recreational boating is at a minimum. Winter kelp farms have great potential in Maine to provide a means for diversification and a way to increase seafood production in the State.

Maine and Alaska are the leading seaweed producers in the USA, the Island Institute from the State of Maine suggests that the annual haul of farmed seaweed in Maine could top more than 3 million pounds by 2035.

The Seagriculture USA conference is an addition to the European edition of Seagriculture, which has been successfully organized since 2012 and has built up a solid reputation as the leading conference for seaweed farming in Europe. Besides the expansion of the brand to North America, the organizers have also launched an Asia-Pacific edition of the conference which will be held from 8 - 9 February 2023 in an online format.
