What are teeth whitening strips?

Whitestrips are flexible strips or material usually coated with Carbamide, Hydrogen Peroxide, Chlorite or Charcoal. Other less active ingredients are then used to support these active ones.

Whitening strips are designed to bleach off stains and discolouration from the surface of the teeth. They can remove extrinsic stains, which are the visible ones that you see on the outer layer of the teeth. Some can even penetrate deep enough to remove intrinsic stains on the teeth's inner layers.

Extrinsic stains are caused by daily habits and consumption, such as beverages, certain foods, black tea, smoking, etc. Intrinsic stains are caused by factors such as ageing, tooth condition, and medications.

Whitestrips are easy to use, as long as you follow the teeth whitening instructions that come in the package. This is, of course, vital if you want to achieve the best results. They are also a less stressful and cheaper way of whitening your teeth compared to undergoing dental procedures.

Whitestrips are applied by simply peeling the strips away and placing the gel side onto your teeth along the gum line. Press the strip firmly to your teeth and fold the remainder of the strip around the back of your teeth.

What ingredients are used?

It is normal to be curious about the ingredients contained in any product you want to use, and this is especially important when it comes to your teeth. 

Hydrogen Peroxide

Teeth are made up of different layers. The outer layer is known as the enamel and is the surface of the teeth. The middle layer is located beneath the enamel. It is called dentin and is mainly composed of protein. The inner layer is primarily made up of connective tissues, blood vessels and nerves that safely bind the gum.

Studies have shown that <u>hydrogen peroxide</u> can be dangerous to the dentin layer, which, as stated earlier, contains a high amount of protein (mostly in the form of collagen). It may pierce through the enamel and penetrate the dentin, fragmenting or dissolving the collagen. This is one of the most common dangers of whitening strips.

While whitening strips are considered safe for use, they are not without their side-effects. Experiencing teeth sensitivity and/or irritated gums may be adverse after-effects you might have

to deal with. Having said that, these problems usually lie with hydrogen peroxide based strips, so they may be avoided if you seek alternatives.

Tooth sensitivity occurs as a result of worn-out enamel or exposed nerves. You may experience sensitivity at any time during the teeth whitening treatment, or you may not experience it at all. There are simply no hard and fast rules about how people might react to treatment, as everybody's teeth are different. Tooth sensitivity can last for several days if your gums are already infected or inflamed with a gum disease known as gingivitis.
