Why Crest's White Teeth Strips are Banned in Europe

The importance of oral health in relation to the human body's overall hygiene is critical and something that we don't want to put at risk. But **Crest's white teeth strips** have raised some concern. Generally, whitening strips contain two brightening agents: hydrogen peroxide and carbamide peroxide. When it comes to using these brightening formulae, the European Commission has set maximum limits to protect human health: <u>6% for dentists</u> and only <u>0.1% for DIY</u> use. Crest's white teeth strips contain a hydrogen peroxide level of around <u>14%</u>, which significantly exceeds the limit and enters the dangerous level zone.

Due to this potential risk to human health, it is quite clear why Crest's white teeth strips are banned in the EU and have been recalled by the European Commission for not complying with the Cosmetic Products Regulation.

Doctor's Viewpoint

While **Crest** and many other brands have tried to influence an increase to the European safety limits when using hydrogen peroxide, we wanted to hear from the professionals in the field.

In a study, <u>Dr. Keenan said</u>, "Our results show that treatment with <u>hydrogen peroxide</u> concentrations similar to those found in whitening strips is enough to make the original collagen protein disappear." Explaining his statement, he mentioned that the concentrated levels of hydrogen peroxide shrink the major protein into smaller fragments, and this could weaken teeth and gums.

<u>Dr. Liechtung</u> shared his concerns saying, "Chronic whiteners could end up causing themselves tooth damage." The doctor said that bleaching the teeth shouldn't be a common task, and overdoing it can cause severe erosion.

The research director, <u>Dr. Li</u>, said, "The peroxides used in tooth bleach, hydrogen peroxide and carbamide peroxide (which contains hydrogen peroxide), produce free radicals that can damage the cells of the gums or the pulp inside teeth." He further added, "The lower your overall exposure to these peroxides, the lower your risk."

Side Effects of Crest's White Teeth Strips

Crest's white teeth strips do brighten the teeth, but they don't only cost in price; they may also cost you your oral health. Though the cases are rare, this high percentage of hydrogen peroxide can bring serious health risks. The nature of hydrogen peroxide can chronically erode tooth enamel and cause dental cell damage.

Tooth Sensitivity

Throat Infection

The primary concern with whitening strips is that the peroxides in them can be swallowed unintentionally. With Crest's white teeth strips, there is an even greater risk of undesirable effects due to the higher level of active hydrogen peroxide. If the strip itself or substantial amounts of peroxide are swallowed, there is a significant risk of throat and stomach irritation or infection.

Gum Irritation

The caustic nature of the peroxide chemicals that are present in whitening strips can result in irritation of our gums. Since **Crest's white teeth strips** are overloaded with hydrogen peroxide, there is a probability that 1 in 3 people, or even 1 in 2, are likely to experience <u>gum irritation</u> caused by these whitening strips.
